How you can help:

Personal Social and Emotional Development – Help your child to express their feelings and consider the feelings of others, manage their own personal hygiene, show resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge and to build constructive and respectful relationships.

Literacy – Children will receive a Read Write Inc book from their RWI group weekly.

Communication and Language – Talk about the stories, poems and rhymes they listen to and support your child with responding to 'How do you know' questions.

Math – Count objects at home and in the community. Look for patterns and shapes in the world. Play mathematical games involving dice, counting, number matching and identification.

Understanding the World – Talk about space and what makes our planet Earth special, how we can look after it and how it is different from other planets in our solar system. Also, support your child in exploring the exciting world of Transport and Travel - how transport has changed over time and discovering the many ways people travel today — by land, sea, and air.

Physical Development – Support with a range of ball skills. Spend time exploring movement (e.g. running, stepping, climbing, balancing). Encourage independence, for example dressing and undressing and using cutlery at mealtimes.

Expressive Arts and Design – Encourage your child to draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as representing a face with a circle and including details.

PE

The children will participate in PE sessions each week. **On our PE day, Thursday, children will be required to wear their PE kit in school for the whole day.** The children will be going outside and will need suitable outside kit, including trainers or plimsolls. School PE kit is a white or yellow t-shirt, black or blue shorts and trainers or plimsolls.

Religious Education

All year groups study a range of religious beliefs in a knowledge capacity. In terms 3 and 4, we will explore Easter and why it is important for Christians.
