DISCOVE

Reading, times tables/KIRFs and spellings are the main areas you can make a huge difference at home, and these are what we expect the children to complete as homework each week. RWI Reading books are changed on Fridays and the children have a Reading Journal that they can bring backwards and forwards from school to track their reading at home. Please supply comments. Year 2 Children will start the Renaissance Reading program when they are ready. Children should try to read with an adult every day; a good guide is 30 mins per day. It is even more helpful if you can ask them questions about what they have been reading, or to predict what they think will happen next.

Each week, your child will be given a list of spellings for their age group. They are tested once a week, on a Friday. You can really support your child by helping them to learn their spellings at home. A few minutes each evening or as you are walking to or from school will make all the difference.

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The children will continue to participate in PE sessions each week. Our topic this term is 'Athletics'. Our PE days are **Monday** and **Tuesday (Zimmer), Tuesday** and **Thursday (P** and **Vivaldi)**.

Children will be required to come in wearing their PE kit for the whole term. The children will be going outside and will need suitable outside kit including trainers or plimsolls. School PE kit consists of black/navy shorts, yellow t-shirt/polo shirt, black plimsolls, trainers. Black/navy sweatshirts and tracksuit bottoms can be worn in winter. Please no hoodies or logo sweatshirts. Earrings must be removed for PE by the child, or not worn to school on that day please.

Religious Education

All year groups study a range of religious beliefs in a knowledge capacity. In terms 5 and 6, we will explore what Christians believe is the 'Good News' that Jesus brings and wha. makes some places sacred to believers.

MATHS: We will start learning about fractions, recognising halves, guarters and thirds of objects, shapes or guantities. We will also learn the difference between unit and non-unit fractions. We will also start learning about statistics and position and direction.

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TERM 5: World Explorers

Book: The Secret of Black Rock

HISTORY: We will be exploring the lives of significant explorers e.g.

Drake, Shakleton, Edmund Hillary,

Tenzing Norgay, David Livingstone

and Freya Stark from local and world

COMPUTING: We will be exploring online reputation and online bullying. We will explain how information put online about someone can last, how anyone's online information can be seen by others and know who to talk to if something has been put up

humans.

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ENGLISH: We will be looking at The Secret of Black Rock and writing our own Return Narratives about a character who goes on a journey to a dangerous location.



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RWInc will take place daily and the children will be grouped and taught to their individual levels.

MUSIC: We will be exploring the music 'Earth' composed by Hans Zimmer to create and perform a musical journey using turned and untuned instruments. We will be creating simple melodies from five or more notes and begin exploring musical notation.

SCIENCE: We will be exploring living things and their habitats. We will be understanding the different ocean habitats that animals live in, explaining the different life cycles of sea creatures and exploring ocean food chains.

ENGLISH: We will be looking at writing hunting narratives based on the book 'The Last Wolf about a character who sets off to catch an animal but ends up making friends with them. We will then be looking at recipes - how to feed a hungry animal – writing a recipe with equipment, ingredients list and method steps.
