

Year 6

Autumn Term Learning







On the reverse, please find an outline of your child's learning for Term I and 2.

We will be focusing on settling in and finding time to catch up with our friends and our new classes. We are so pleased to see the school full of children again and we are really impressed with the ambition we have seen in the classroom so far.

How you can help:

Reading, times tables and spellings are the main areas you can make a huge difference with at home, and these are what we expect the children to complete as homework each week. Reading books are changed when the children are ready to change their books in school. Children are still using the Renaissance Reading program. Children should try to read with an adult every day; a good guide is 30 mins per day. It is even more helpful if you can ask them questions about what they have been reading, or to predict what they think will happen next.

Each week, your child will be given a list of spellings for their age group. They are tested once a week, on a Friday. You can really support your child by helping them to learn their spellings at home. A few minutes each evening or as you are walking to or from school will make all the difference.

Children in Y6 will learn recover all the times tables each week. When they have learnt up to the 12x table, they will have a grid format which helps them remember all their tables. Children have access to a website called Times table Rockstars which they will have their password for and it helps them to practice their tables in an engaging way. You can also help by listening to the children recite their tables or asking questions for the children to answer.

The children will continue to participate in PE sessions each week. Our sports this term are cricket and martial arts. On our PE day, Year 6, children will be required to wear a PE kit to school. The children will be going inside and outside and will need suitable outside kit including trainers or plimsolls. School PE kit is a white t-shirt, black or blue shorts, clean socks and trainers or plimsolls. Earrings must be removed for PE by the child, or not worn to school on that day please. Our usual PE days will be Monday and Wednesday; however, we may take part in other outdoor activities during the week, which will be completed in school uniform.



Religious Education

All year groups study a range of religious beliefs in a knowledge capacity. In terms I and 2, we will explore Why do some people do and do not believe in God? and Creation and science: conflicting or complementary?

MATHS Our priority this term is to reinforce prior learning of place value and the four mathematical operations, as well as consolidating these principles to answer a range of mental and written problems. An emphasis will also be placed on developing a secure recall of number facts and times tables.





COMPUTING As well as using ICT across the curriculum to support their learning, the children will also be looking into the different levels of internet safety and why it is important.



ENGLISH Year 6 will start the term focusing on a recount by writing a diary and a bravery speech, this will be related to the class book of Rose Blanche which looks at the First world War. We will be focusing our reading around War Horse, discussing the themes around animal cruelty, war and how this links to Devon and Dartmoor. Children will undertake weekly handwriting lessons along with SPAG lessons.

SCIENCE In Science this term, the children will be studying 'Living Things, Habitats and classification'. We will be using this to look at our local habitat of Dartmoor to investigate and research the animals and plants. Scientific knowledge and understanding will be used to ask questions to

find answers.



MUSIC We will be looking at Folk music that would have been experienced on the moors. We will be finding out about the history of folk music on Dartmoor and listen to / appreciate a variety of Folk music. The children will be learning to play Glockenspiels.

FRENCH We will be exploring the days of the week along with months and time. 0=0

PSHE We will be exploring how we can keep healthy as we grow? This will include how we can keep our bodies and mind healthy and what happens if we don't.



ENGLISH We will be exploring narrative flashbacks and what that entails as well as writing a newspaper report. These pieces of writing are going to be linked to our class book 'A story like the Wind'. Handwriting will be continued on a weekly basis.

SCIENCE – Electricity and the importance and development in Tudor Britain. The children will be looking at the brightness of lamps and the effect of voltage and cells.

FRENCH We will be exploring names for different pets and then developing structured French sentences to create a conversation regarding pets.



MATHS Our work this term will focus on addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, linked to our work on Place Value last term. We will continue to work on key facts recall and support the children with any gaps in knowledge. times tables will also be a focus.
